## Mazurca Di Sant' Andieu

Piedmont, Italy

This mazurka originated in the south of France during the Occitan Kingdom and is now danced all over Piedmont.

Pronunciation: mah-ZOOR-kah dee SAHNT ahn-DEE-uh

Formation: Couples in large circle facing LOD

- **Position:** In Varsovienne position: W to R of M, M's R arm over W's shoulders, R hands joined to right of W, L hands joined in front
- **Steps:** *Waltz steps:* Step fwd on L slightly to L (1), step on R close to L (2), step fwd on L slightly to L (3). Repeat with opposite footwork
- **Meter:** 3/4
- Meas Introduction
- 1-16 No action

## Figure (waltz)

- 1-2 Starting with L, dance 2 Waltz steps in LOD
- 3-4 Starting with L, dance 2 *Waltz steps,* M in LOD, while W turns CW to R under M's R arm
- 5-16 Repeat meas 1-4 three more times

## Chorus (mazurka)

- 1 Step on L foot in front (1), step on R foot back (2), small hop on R (3), lifting L leg in front
- 2 Men: moving to R and passing behind partner, step on L crossed behind R (1), step on R to R (2), step on L in front of R (3)

Women: moving to L and passing in front of partner, step on L to L (1), step on R close to L (2), step on L to L (3)

- 3-4 Repeat meas 1-2 with opp ftwrk and direction
- 5-16 Repeat meas 1-4 three more times

Repeat Figure and Chorus to end of music
