# E' Huli Makou

Hawai'i

"E huli makou" translates as "Let's all turn." It is a modern-style hula. Hilde learned it from Anne-Kristine Tischendorf.

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Pronunciation: ay HOO-li ma-Koh

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**Introduction:** Wait out the instrumental refrain and begin on the sung verse.

## Meas Footwork

Start with right foot out to front.

#### I. <u>1<sup>st</sup> verse</u>

- 1-2 Kalakaua R, with turn.
- 3-4 Kalakaua L, with turn.

## Refrain (includes resting step)

- 1 Kaholo R on R diagonal.
- 2 Kaholo L back to starting point.
- 3-4 Ami poniu ("around the Isle") CCW.
- 5-6 Repeat meas 1-2 of refrain

#### <u>Resting Step</u>

- 7 Kaholo R
- 8 Kaholo L

## II. <u>2<sup>nd</sup> verse</u>

- 1 Ka'o R (ct 1,2), Ka'o L (ct 3,4)
- 2 Kaholo R
- 3 Ka'o L (ct 1,2), Ka'o R
- 4 Kaholo L.

# III. <u>3rd verse</u>

- 1 O R
- 2 O L
- 3 O R
- 4 O L

# IV. <u>4th verse</u>

- 1 Kaholo R slight diagonal R
- 2 Kaholo L slight diagonal L
- 3 O R (forward with ¼ L turn). That is, ¼ turn to L, step R ft fwd, lift and replace L ft in place, ½ turn to R, step R ft next to L, touch L toes next to R.
- 4 O L (forward with ¼ R turn). That is, step L ft fwd, lift and replace R ft in place, ¼ turn L to face front, step L ft next to R, touch R toes next to L.

# <u>Ending</u>

Weight on L, step on R ft behind L, hands on shoulders, then arms out.

#### Sequence: 1<sup>st</sup> verse + refrain

- 1<sup>st</sup> verse + refrain
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> verse + refrain
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> verse + refrain
  - 4<sup>th</sup> verse + refrain
  - 4<sup>th</sup> verse + refrain + ending

# **Hula Steps**

Starting point: feet hip width apart, bent knees

- **Kalakaua:** With wt on L ft, touch R toes, ¼ turn to the L, step fwd on R ft, lift and replace L ft in place, step back on R ft, lift and replace L ft in place, step fwd on R ft, lift and replace L ft in place, step R ft where you started (hip width), ½ turn to the R. Touch L toes next to R ft, stepping fwd on the L ft repeat above with opp footwork.
- **Kaholo:** With wt on L ft, R ft steps to the R while hip swings to R, place L ft next to R ft (hip swings L), R ft steps to the R side (hip swings R), touch L toes next to R ft (hip stays R). Weight now on R ft. Repeat above with opp footwork.
- **Ami poniu:** 4 ami (hips tilt back and over to the R side and back to neutral) with ¼ turn for each, so when you are done you have made a full circle. Step fwd on R, ami, step in place on L, ¼ turn, step R to the side, ami, and so on.
- **Ka'o:** Change of wt between R and L ft with "figure of 8" hip movement. Start with hip towards the L and wt on L ft, shift wt to R ft while hip goes up and over to the R, repeat with L.
- **O:** Step back on R ft, lift and replace L ft in place, step R ft next to the L, touch L toes next to R. Stepping back on L repeat above with opp footwork.
