# Aia la 'o Pele i Hawai'i by Charles Ka'upu

A hula dance about Pele, the volcano goddess.

## Introduction

Fists on hips; on 3rd beat, bend knees, say name

# **<u>Refrain</u>** (arms bent in front of chest, palms down)

Ct 1: Step R, uwehe (pop knees apart)

Ct 2: Step L, uwehe

#### Verse 1 - Aia la 'o Pele...

## Kalakaua R

feet: turn L, step R to L (ct 1), lift L, step back on R (ct 2), lift L, step R to L (ct 3), lift L, half turn R, step R in place (ct 4), touch L toes in place

arms: L arm bent, R arm extended to L (ct 1) palm down, move R to front (ct 2), move R to L (ct 3), bend R (ct 4). Look over hand.

**Kalakaua L** - same with opp feet and arms

Refrain as above

Repeat all

### Verse 2 - Uhi uha...

## Hela R, L, R, L

feet: touch R fwd to R corner (ct 1), step R in place (ct &), repeat with L, R, L (cts 2,3,4) arms: R arm fwd to R corner, L bent (ct 1), L fwd to L corner, R bent (ct 2), repeat (cts 3,4)

## Lele forward to R corner

feet: Step R (ct 1), L, R (ct 2), bend R knee, lift L behind, walk back L (ct 3), R, L (ct 4), pause arms: R on top of left (ct 1), R circles around L, R back on top (ct 2), L stays under R elbow, R extends fwd to R corner palm up & stays (cts 3,4)

Refrain as above

Repeat all

### Verse 3 - Ka mea nani kai...

# Hela R, L, R, L

feet: same as Verse 2

arms: L extended to L; R dips into L (cts 1,2),

raise R (cts 3,4); L stays extended horiz to L

#### Hela R, L, R, L

feet: same as Verse 2

arms: bend at hip and cross arms down on R (ct 1), open arms up on left ending with both arms vertically up (ct 2), repeat (cts 3,4)

Refrain as above

Repeat all

# Verse 4 - Aia ka palena...

# Kaholo R, L

feet: step R (ct 1), close L, step R (ct 2), touch L, repeat starting L (cts 3,4)

arms: start elbows out, hands chest high, palms down; L bent, R straight ahead (ct 1,2), R bent, L straight ahead (cts 3,4)

#### Hela R, L, R, L

feet: same as Verse 2

arms: arms extended down (ct 1), arms to sides in box shape: bent at elbows, upper arm horiz, lower arms vertically up (ct 2), twisting at waist, swing to R (ct 3), swing to L (ct 4)

Refrain as above

Repeat all

## **Verse 5** - I hea kaua...

# Hela R, L, R, L

feet: same as Verse 2

arms: cup L hand around mouth (ct 1), reach R out palm down to L corner (ct 3) and over to R

corner (ct 3,4)

#### Lele backward

feet: traveling straight back, step R (ct 1), touch L, step L, touch R (ct 2), repeat (cts 3,4)

arms: put hands near hips and walk away from hands

Refrain – **Lele forward** 

feet: step R fwd (ct 1), touch L, step L (ct 2), touch R

arms: arms bent in front of chest, palms down

Repeat all

## Verse 6 - Ha'ina...

### Ami kuku R

hips: circles (CCW): 2 slow (cts 1,2), 3 quick (cts 3,4)

arms: R by mouth, L by chest (ct 1), open R arm to R, palms up (ct 2), turn palms down (cts

3,4)

**Ami kuku L** - opposite arms and hip direction

Repeat all

## Ending - Ea la, ea la, ea

Refrain as above

Straighten knees, arms out, R foot out to side (ct 1)

Arms and R foot to corners (ct &)

Bend knees and bend arms in front of chest (ct 2)

Uwehe (ct &)

Repeat with L foot (ct 3&4&)

Step R and reach arm R (ct 1), touch L (ct &)

Step L and reach arm L (ct 2), touch R (ct &)

Step R fwd and reach fwd with both arms (ct 3)

Step L in place (ct &)

Step R back and reach both arms out to sides (ct 4)

Step L in place (ct &)

Point R forward and both arms forward and hold

Say "He inoa no Hi`iaka i ka poli o Pele" which means "This is a name song for Hi`iaka"

End with hands on hips, feet together

Aia lā 'o Pele i Hawai'i 'eā Pele is in Hawai'i

Ke ha'a mai lā i Maukele 'eā She is dancing at Maukele

Ūhī'ūhā mai ana 'eāShe rumbles and muttersKe nome a'e lā iā Puna, 'eāAs she consumes Puna

Ke pulelo a'e lā i nā pali 'eā Rising over the cliffs

Aia ka palena i Maui 'eā She is at the borders of Maui 'Āina o Kaululā'au 'eā Land of the chief Kaululā'au

I hea kāua e la'i ai 'eā? Where will we find peace? I ka 'ale nui a'e li'a nei 'eā On the great billows we love

No Hi'iaka nō he inoa 'eā In honor of Hi'iaka
